Thank you to Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund for providing a [REDACTED] grant to support FareStart’s General Operations. With your help, FareStart continues to promote food security, personal mobility and economic mobility in the greater Seattle community. Alongside accomplishments, FareStart faced challenges largely due to the continued temporary closure of our retail social enterprise businesses. We made pivotal changes necessary to rebuild capacity for training, including formalizing plans to reopen our flagship FareStart Restaurant in 2024 after more than four years of temporary closure.

FareStart’s 2023 highlights include:

- Restarting more in-person, on-the-job training, including adult training throughout FareStart facilities, restarting youth Barista & Customer Service training in the FareStart Café in South Lake Union and reopening the FareStart Café on Beacon Hill
- Hosting our first two in-person job fairs since the pandemic
- Continuing impactful food security work as we shift to more sustainable long-term strategies to provide prepared meals to community partners, fresh produce to individuals through our Mobile Community Market and hosting a robust food recovery program
- Developing business plans to reopen FareStart’s social enterprises (restaurant space, catering) with future employment pathways, based on in-depth market analysis with Deloitte Consulting
