## Tulalip Tribes Year End Report Q1 2017 14.2.

Last year Jubilee Women's Center received a grant in the amount of [REDACTED] towards sponsorship for our annual Luncheon Benefit. This funding from the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund was utilized to underwrite our fundraiser which helped raise the necessary funds to meet women's most basic needs of housing, shelter and clothing. We were also able to raise additional support towards critical self-sufficiency, such as technology training, employment assistance, life skills classes and one-on-one care management.

Since 1983, Jubilee has transformed the lives of hundreds of women by ending the cycle of poverty and homelessness, supporting them as they move out of crisis and into a stable life. Jubilee is a resource for more than 2,000 low-income women annually, providing an open computer lab, referral services, and a clothing boutique at no cost to clients. In addition, we provide intensive support to approximately 65 women annually. Our programs are based on client driven self-assessments to identify individual needs, and are designed to help women take the time they need to develop skills and make long-term behavioral changes, while increasing their self-esteem, resilience, employment skills, communication, and money management abilities.

Last year Jubilee served 65 women who received housing, care management and community meals, for 16 months on average. Another 2,085 homeless and low-income women were served through classes, community referral services and our clothing boutique. Last year:

- 68% of residents successfully moved into independent housing
- 40% of eligible residents gained employment;
- 35% of residents who could increase their income did so
- 66% completed an outside job training or school program;
- 53 courses were offered, over 133 class sessions to which 184 unduplicated women participated
- 3,680 individual meals were prepared by volunteers (115 community dinners).

In fiscal year 2017-2018, Jubilee plans to:

- Offer safe community housing and wraparound support for 75 women;
- Provide 155 educational sessions for 125 residents and other women in our community;
- Ensure that 90% of workshop attendees increase specific knowledge and skills;
- Assist approximately 80% of eligible residents to gain employment; and
- Provide 1,500 women with free clothing, community referrals and computer access.

We are very honored and grateful to the Tulalip Tribe Charitable Fund for its continued support of Jubilee Women's Center. Your support has helped us to serve more women experiencing poverty in our community.
