ASAS Puget Sound was grateful to have received continued funding from Tulalip Tribes last year. We are delighted to share our progress and highlights. During the 2024-2025 school year, we served Lakota Middle School (Federal Way), Meeker Middle School (Kent/Renton), and Showalter Middle School (Tukwila). We are very excited to be working with some of the most diverse school districts in the nation—in Federal Way, Kent, and Tukwila. We served **639 students** in grades 6th-8th during the 2024-2025 school year.

ASAS provided a variety of after-school academic, enrichment, and wellness programs including sports, dance & cheer, yoga, cooking and nutrition, photography, coding and game design, STEM, skateboard-making & skateboarding, DJ/music production, creative arts, martial arts, and more. Students also participated in several field trips:

- ★ Microsoft Campus Tour with Webs + Devices: Blacks at Microsoft—90 students (October 2024)
- ★ Kraken Community Iceplex 90 students (February 2025)
- ★ Museum of Pop Culture—30 students (March 2025)
- **★ T-Mobile Tech Experience Center & Headquarters**—90 students (March & April 2025)
- ★ Museum of Flight—30 students (April 2025)
- ★ Alaska Airlines Aviation Day—12 students (June 2025)
- ★ Bradley Lake Park 50 students (June 2025)
- ★ Milton Skatepark—15 students (June 2025)

According to our participant pre-and-post surveys, students reported the following:

Expanded World View:

• 81% of student participants reported that they were exposed to new opportunities and interests

Interpersonal Relationships:

- 85% of student participants reported that they had an adult to count on
- 80% of student participants reported new connections with positive peers

Intrapersonal Development:

- 92% of student participants improved their self-awareness
- 75% of student participants improved their responsible decision-making & self-efficacy

Relationship Skills:

- 90% of student participants improved their friendship skills
- 79% of student participants improved their relationship skills

Academic Support:

- 77% of student participants reported a perceived influence on academics
- 78% of student participants reported a sense of connection to school
- 67% of student participants improved their "Grit"/persistence in academic endeavors

Career Exploration:

75% of student participants improved their belief in own potential for career success

- 70% of student participants improved their intention to pursue advanced coursework in their preferred field
- 71% of student participants improved their knowledge of educational or training pathways
- 73% of student participants reported knowledge of potential careers

Health & Wellness:

- 78% of student participants reported physical wellness: desire to make healthy choices
- 71% of student participants improved their physical wellness: enjoyment of movement like a sport, dance, etc.

Social Emotional Learning (SEL):

80% of student participants improved their SEL composite

Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM):

- 72% of student participants improved their critical thinking
- 68% of student participants improved their perceived usefulness of math
- 69% of student participants improved their problem solving
- 71% of student participants improved their STEM identity

Visual & Performing Arts:

- 60% of student participants improved their arts career interest
- 71% of student participants improved their engagement with constructive feedback
