Dear Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund,

Arts Corps deeply appreciates your contribution of [REDACTED] to support our programs and general operating expenses during the July 1, 2025 - June 30, 2026 fiscal year. The Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund allows Arts Corps to continue offering cultural arts programming, vocational training, and professional development for young people ages 5 to 25, families, educators, and community organizations. Your support helps us reach 2,300 people across King County, Pierce County, and Yakima County, Washington.

Participants immerse in Capoeira, theater, printmaking, animation, spoken word, hip hop dance, vocal training, and many other multidisciplinary art forms. Yearlong cultural arts programming are in partnership with Seattle, Highline, and Franklin-Pierce Public School Districts; Best Start for Kids; King County Juvenile Detention Center; Southwest Youth & Family Services; Nuestra Casa; Amara Family Services; Communities in Schools; Partners in Print; and 20 other youth, arts, and support services organizations.

Arts Corps Program Highlights - July 1, 2025 - June 30, 2026 Fiscal Year

- Teaching Artists implemented 102 during and afterschool arts enrichment programs, and paid teen art internships for young people ages 5 to 25. Weekly classes are always free-of-cost for participants, occurring throughout the year for 1 to 2 hours per week in 8 to 10-week sessions. Classes include all art supplies, with some educators offering multilingual instruction in English and Spanish to support participants' language access needs.
- Arts Corps compensated 20 teens ages 11 to 19 to participate in Art 4 Life, our paid arts internship programs occurring in July 2025 and April 2026. Art 4 Life teen interns receive 30 to 60 hours of arts training and career mentorship.
- Arts Corps teaching artists attended nearly 50 hours of educator professional development training through Arts Corps' in-house professional training program, and workshops offered through our community partners such as Partners in Print, School's Out Washington Bridge Conference, Amara Family Services, Seattle Theatre Education Coalition, ArtsWA, and other organizations.



- In partnership with the 5th Avenue Theatre, Arts Corps distributed over 70 tickets to five 5th Avenue Theatre productions. Free tickets were distributed to youth participants, families, Arts Corps staff and board members, and our community partners.

Arts Corps fostered new partnerships with:

- **Partners in Print** to co-design our printmaking cohorts for Art 4 Life Summer 2026, and offer yearlong professional development opportunities for our participants and Teaching Artists.
- **The Sound Transit** to launch the Safety Poster Design Competition. Arts Corps received 150 submissions from K-12 students across King County. All 150 art submissions were publicly displayed in a gallery at Union Station, and three winners were compensated for their artwork to be displayed on the Sound Transit 1 and 2 Lines.
- **The Highline Public Schools VOICES Program** to serve as an internship learning site for Highline high school students in grades 10 - 12. Amira, our VOICES intern, has received academic elective credits, a \$500 honorarium, and career readiness certificate upon her completion of 40 hours of in-person service with Arts Corps.

Testimonies from our participants and community partners

- Arts Corps' All City Youth Choir have received increased invitations to perform within and outside Arts Corps. Our choir members are compensated to perform at Arts Corps' Back to School Fair in September 2025 and annual Thrive Spring Fundraiser in April 2026. In May 2026, the choir performed during a pre-show event at the 5th Avenue Theatre production of Jesus Christ Superstar.
- Garrett and Pedro have totaled over \$4,000 selling artwork through our Print 4 Life printmaking programs at Interagency Academy. Garrett, an Indigenous student, was a featured artist and speaker at our 2026 Spring Fundraiser. He's completed logo commissions from Seattle Kingmakers and Washington Ethnic Studies Now. Pedro, a formerly incarcerated teen, was a featured artist at our fundraisers, student showcases, and community events. He's completed arts commissions from Seattle Vespa Club and the City of Seattle. Garrett and Pedro have received Career Technical Education credits required for graduation.
