**How funds were used**

Tulalip Tribes Charitable Funds were used to purchase two custom built Paragon Janus Ovation Glass/Pottery Kilns (pictured below). *The kilns are ordered and currently under construction.*



The Paragon Janus Ovation kilns can fire both pottery and glass, and will be used in Kiln Casting Studio and are central to finishing Phase II of the Schack Art Center.

Kiln cast glass has become an important material for contemporary artists, and this large volume kiln will allow artists to cast large 3-dimensional glass sculptures, and at the same time provide new learning opportunities for students ages 15 and older.

As an example of kiln Casting, Tulalip Artist, James Madison, has used this process for making tribal masks and ceremonial hats.
