On behalf of Bastyr University ([www.bastyr.edu](http://www.bastyr.edu)), I would like to express our appreciation for the grant (Q4 2017 14.2) of [REDACTED] from the Tulalip Cares Fund in support of the Bastyr gardens including the medicinal plants and the Sacred Seeds Ethnobotanical Trail.



The goal of the proposed project was “to meet the need for increased access to the garden and trail as well as provide much needed educational opportunities so that the greater community can respectfully develop a better understanding of plants indigenous to the Pacific Northwest—especially the medicinal and nutritional values they offer.”

The following is an update on the status of accomplishments/deliverables since the grant was received in March 2018. Please note that the initial request to accomplish these deliverables was for [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] was awarded. Therefore, the following deliverables were prioritized and undertaken to the best of our ability with fewer resources.

1. Create a voluntary **advisory committee** of community members and Bastyr staff and faculty with a vested interest in educational and outreach materials. The committee will consult with key project staff on content of outreach and educational materials (print and digital) as well as any signage and be compensated for their time. UPDATE – In 2019 the committee was formed from four members of local tribal nations: Mike Evans (Snohomish), Sheila McCoy Hillaire (Tulalip), Val Segrest (Muckleshoot) and Pamela Bond (Snohomish). We had our first committee meeting on 5/17/2019 to walk the Sacred Seeds together and consult on content, signage and educational materials. Our next meeting will be in Fall 2019 on a digital platform.
