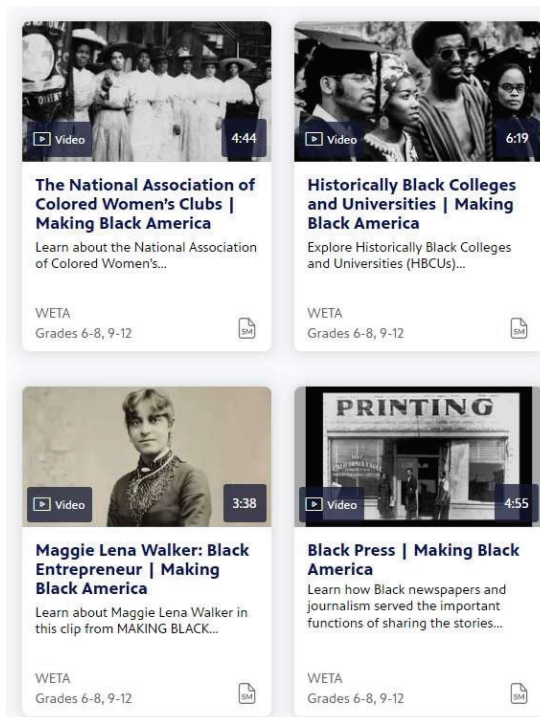

BlackPast.org is pleased to provide this report for the Tulalip Tribes' generous ██████ grant in May 2023. We would also like to express our gratitude for the Foundation's support in previous years.

Approximately 6.5 million people visited BlackPast.org in 2023, the largest audience we have ever had and the fourth record-setting year in a row. February 2023 also marked our second consecutive Black History Month with over a million visitors.

In 2023, volunteer contributors wrote more than 130 new articles. One new article relating to King County details the fascinating story of Addie Fletcher Booth, a Seattle-based labor organizer whose efforts helped lead to the 1949 passage of a Washington state law that banned race-based employment discrimination. We also engaged with WETA, a division of PBS, to create Black history lesson plans as part of Making Black America, an educational series narrated by Henry Louis Gates, Jr. These went live in February 2023 and include essays written by BlackPast contributors. These lessons were created to meet curriculum requirements for the Washington Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI). The site has maintained consistent uptime and has successfully accommodated our growing audience in 2023, including during exceptionally busy times such as Black History Month.
