Project Summary

The 15th Annual Celebrating Salish Conference was held in March 2025 in Spokane, Washington. The event united over 800 participants from more than 25 Tribal Nations to strengthen and celebrate the Salish languages. With Tulalip Charitable Fund support, we reduced participation costs, provided scholarships, and ensured that Elders and youth could gather to share and preserve language and culture.

Total Number of Recipients Impacted

Total Participants: 800+

Tribal Nations Represented: 25+

• Youth Participants: 150

• Elders: 200

• Scholarship Recipients: 40 youth and Elders

Educators Receiving Toolkits: 50

All funds were expended as approved and the project is complete.

Project Results

- Hosted 30 workshops, including a dedicated youth track with storytelling, language games, and song.
- Provided travel stipends and registration support for participants from remote communities.
- Distributed 50 Salish Language Teaching Toolkits to educators.
- Recorded and archived Elder presentations to preserve knowledge for future generations.
- Strengthened intergenerational learning between fluent speakers and youth.
