Note: This report was originally planned for delivery at the end of 2025. We felt it made more sense to report after the conclusion of summer camp last week, so that this report could reflect a fuller picture of the grant's impact.

Impact Summary

This grant supported programming that reached more than 4,000 youth across Snohomish County during the grant period. These young people participated in Camp Fire Snohomish County's outdoor education, camp, and youth development programs, gaining access to hands-on learning, mentorship, and time outdoors that many would not otherwise have.

Organizational Context

Camp Fire Snohomish County has served local youth and families for nearly 100 years. Camp Killoqua, our 180-acre lakefront property in Stanwood, is celebrating its 85th anniversary and remains the physical home for much of our outdoor education and residential camp programming, including three-day residential experiences for fifth and sixth graders.

This grant's support arrived at a pivotal moment for outdoor learning access in Washington State, following significant cuts to state-level outdoor education funding. It allowed us to sustain program quality and reach at a time when many partner organizations were scaling back.

Use of Funds

This grant's flexible operating support proved especially valuable following an unplanned expense last winter, when a tree fell on one of our cabins at Camp Killoqua. These funds allowed us to complete repairs in time for summer camp, ensuring no disruption to our residential programming.

Looking Ahead

We are grateful for this partnership and the confidence it reflects in Camp Fire Snohomish County's work. We look forward to building on this year's outcomes and keeping Tulalip Tribes informed as our programs continue to grow.
