Thank you for your incredibly generous support of

Camp Korey in 2023! Your generosity made it possible for **over 2,600** children with complex medical conditions and their family members to experience the magic of camp.

We started last year in January offering our first Caregiver's Retreat for medical professionals and parents who care for kids with life-altering medical conditions. We were excited to offer this time of respite and connection to those who spend so much of their time caring for others. We believe caregivers need care too! The event was such a hit that we have the next one scheduled for January 19-21, 2024, and space has been filling up fast! As is the case with all our programs, this retreat will be offered completely free of charge.

This past year also saw other exciting changes, like being able to offer camper-only programming again. During the pandemic, we switched to having Family Summer Camps where families were in their own family groups or "pods" and did activities together while maintaining social distancing from other families. In 2023, because of the more accurate "Rapid-PCR" COVID test kits we were able to purchase, kids got to take off their masks and be with their friends again, having all kinds of Camp Korey fun! Summer Family Camp during the pandemic showed us how special it was for families to spend a whole week at camp together, so we kept two of the eight summer camp sessions as Family Camp weeks. It was the best of both worlds!







GOALS MET

Camp Korey's overall goal is to improve the quality of life for children, and to ensure that kids living with complex medical conditions have access to camp programs in an inclusive, adaptive setting where they can build friendships and challenge themselves to try new things.

- Foster a sense of community between families
- Increase camper's and family's sense of safety and belonging
- Ensure 100% of campers can participate in all recreational activities
- ▼ Increase resilience, connection, autonomy and positive self-image
- Inspire campers to try new things and challenge themselves to grow

IMPACT

Camp Korey measures the impact of our programs with a survey using tailored metrics developed by our program and nursing staff. At the close of each program, camper families are asked to provide feedback regarding program outcomes and benefits. This survey is designed to measure the extent to which campers experienced positive impacts such as increased confidence, independence, and sense of belonging.

Camp Korey is proud to report that in 2023, over 90% of camper families responded with "Agree" or "Strongly Agree" to the following statements:

"Camp Korey helps my child..."

- be more open to trying new things: 98%
- **▼** develop confidence: 100%
- ♥ feel a sense of belonging: 100%
- feel less isolated: 98%
- feel more comfortable to participate in group settings: 98%
- discover new strengths or talents: 93%
- feel accepted for being who they are: 100%
- develop greater independence: 97%



Research shows that through each activity and program, campers have opportunities for success, reflection, and discovery which build skills that will last a lifetime.

PROGRAMS

Summer Camp

Eight sessions of Summer Camp served 274 kids and family members, with six weeks of camper-only programming and two Family Camp weeks. Activities included archery, adaptive cycling, swimming, arts & crafts, and lots of laughter with new friends.



Family Weekends

During **Eight** Family Weekends, **327** children and their family members spent 3 days and 2 nights together at camp. Each weekend was designed for families living with specific medical conditions, including Turner Syndrome, Skeletal Dysplasia, Congenital Heart Defects, Solid Organ Transplants, and Reconstructive Pelvic Medicine.

Family Day Adventures and Pop-Up Programs

Fun-filled single day programs brought 646 children and family members together for events in 2023, including:

- Adaptive Ski Day at Snoqualmie Summit
- Mariners at T-Mobile Park in Seattle
- Bellingham Bells at Joe Martin Field
- Family Zoo Day at Woodland Park Zoo
- Warm Fuzzy Ice Skating Party at Sno-King Ice Arena in Snoqualmie



Camp to You

Camp Korey's Camp to You hospital outreach program brought joyful opportunities for connection, growth, and empowerment to 1,438 children and family members in healthcare settings in 2023. While spending time in medical facilities, children and their families often experience isolation, stress, and uncertainty. Camp to You offers unique, creative, and developmentally appropriate activities to restore joy,



community, and self-esteem to these kids, some of whom spend months at the hospital. Camp Korey staff and volunteers deliver prepackaged activity kits and work collaboratively with healthcare professionals at children's hospitals to provide fun activities on-site. Currently, Camp to You works with Randall and Schriner's Children's Hospitals in Portland, OR., Mary Bridge Children's Hospital in Tacoma, and Seattle Children's Hospital and Ronald McDonald House in Seattle.

EXCITING NEW THINGS AT ARTS & CRAFTS!



Accessibility and inclusion are more than just buzz words at Camp Korey, they are part of who we are and who we always want to be. We want our campers and their families to know that this is their special place, and that means that all our buildings and activity areas need to be accessible to everyone. We're so excited to announce that we just installed **new automatic doors** at the entrance to our Arts & Crafts room located on the lower floor of Harnish Hive! Arts & Crafts is a favorite activity for campers, and this will help all campers to feel empowered in that space. Automatic doors are not the only exciting addition to the Arts & Crafts area. The camp will soon be completing work to make the **new kiln room** fully functional. The kiln has been purchased and will hopefully be installed before the beginning of our 2024 summer

programs. Campers will be able to create wonderful masterpieces that they can take home with them to remember their special time at camp.

WE HAVE A NEW ADA VAN!

We believe that all children should be able to experience both the joys of childhood and the profound, life-changing impact of camp. Sometimes even getting to camp can be a challenge for some of our families, and we want to remove that barrier. In the past we have used our 2001 Dodge Caravan with wheelchair ramp to pick campers up from their home, the airport, and the bus or train station. We've put a lot of miles on it over



the years, and it was starting to become unreliable. With the help of the **Honda USA Foundation**, the **Nysether Family Foundation**, **SeriousFun Children's Network**, the **Janson Foundation**, and **Honeywell Charitable Fund of The Community Foundation of the Rappahannock River Region**, we were able to purchase a 2022 Honda Odyssey van with wheelchair ramp. Now we can transport our campers and families in safety and style!
