**GENERAL GOALS:** Prime Time serves families that have a member who is disabled or has a terminal/serious illness. A wide range of disability types are found among the children and adults who utilize Prime Time. A very large number of the campers with disabilities are under the age of 10 years.

### SPECIFIC USE FOR THIS AWARD:

For the past two camping seasons our weekly camper evaluations frequently mentioned the mattresses were worn out. In fact, it was the most frequently suggested improvement that we could make at camp. Upon researching the condition of the camp's mattresses, we found that 90 percent of the mattresses at camp needed replacement. Attached are a couple of pictures from the arrival of the mattresses in early June 2014. The new mattresses will impact 90% of the campers each season, which in 2014 season - 90% of the 1,151 campers would be 1036 people receiving benefit from the new mattresses.

Dear Ms. Sheldon:

On behalf of Camp Prime Time's Board of Directors and staff I would like to say a heartfelt "Thank You" to the Tulalip Tribe for their generous grant to assist us with two projects. The projects are the replacement of bunk bed mattresses at camp, and a paver pathway connecting the north and south entrances of our newly remodeled lodge.

For the past two camping seasons our weekly camper evaluations frequently mentioned the mattresses were worn out. In fact, it was the most frequently suggested improvement that we could make at camp. Upon researching the condition of the camp's mattresses, we found that 90 percent of the mattresses at camp needed replacement. Attached are a couple of pictures from the arrival of the mattresses in early June 2014. The new mattresses will impact 90% of the campers each season, which in 2014 season - 90% of the 1,151 campers would be 1036 people receiving benefit from the new mattresses.

In the month of October construction of the new paver pathway will begin. This pathway will tie the north and south entrances of the Lodge together. Four years ago a smaller paver patio was installed on the south end of the lodge, which was a major improvement to camp. This patio has turned the south entrance into the main entrance into the lodge.

This new pathway will affect 100% of the visitors to Camp Prime Time. The pathway will make traversing from cabins, to the lodge, and to the restrooms much easier and safer, whether it be by foot, riding in a stroller or baby jogger, and when using a walker. This will be a great improvement, allowing our special needs campers a more level surface to navigate upon, while visiting camp. Attached are a few photos of the previously constructed pathway on the south side of the lodge, and the plans for the layout of the new pathway.

We look forward to sharing in the celebration with the other grant recipients on October 25<sup>th</sup>, 2014.

Last summer we had so many positive comments from our campers on the paver pathway. Many of our campers have mobility issues, and use canes, walkers, strollers, baby joggers. All campers use the lodge as all meals are served in the Lodge dining room, and it has a large play room attached to it, with ping pong, air hockey, toys, games, crafts, etc
