We appreciate your vision for creating healthy communities and are so grateful for your partnership with Canopy Scholars. We have created this report to show how your funds are impacting underserved students in Shoreline.

The students we serve are among the most ethnically diverse and from the lowest-income families in the Shoreline School District. They are bicultural, bilingual, and the first generation in their families to navigate the American school system; their parents have emigrated from Eritrea, Ethiopia, Mexico, El Salvador, Pakistan, and China.

Canopy Scholars gives underserved elementary and middle-school students access to high dosage and relationship based tutoring, a student leadership council, skills workshops, community-building and summer robotics camps.

The Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions Fund specifically supported our robotics camps with a \$█ grant for Chromebook computers. At two weeklong camps in June, students experienced hands-on learning as they built and programed robots. Your funding gave 30 students access to state-of-the-art computers to learn the basics of coding.

Students gained skills in technology, critical thinking, teamwork and communication – all of which are critical school and for their future in our ever-changing world. Your funding helped remove barriers and create education equity for students, their tutors, and their parents – more than 100 people!
