# Our Mission

Cascadia Art Museum celebrates the rich tradition of the visual arts and design in the Northwest during the period 1860-1970. The museum provides enriching experiences for the community through original exhibitions, public programs, publications, and educational outreach. Cascadia Art Museum seeks to tell the complete story of Northwest art history by advancing the work of women, minority, and other artists who historically made substantial contributions to the region's cultural identity.

## Program Purpose

**Cascadia Art for Schools (CAS)** is a sustained, three-part program that explores art concepts and Northwest art meeting Washington State Arts Standards and Since Time Immemorial Curriculum. CAS provides informal integrated arts education for grades K-8 in a welcoming and inclusive environment through two program focus options: Sharing Our Story and Building Blocks of Art.

Each program has three components that explore the art of the Northwest through facilitated dialogue, storytelling, and hands on art creation. The three components are: a pre-recorded video lesson, museum field trip, and an in-classroom art lesson.

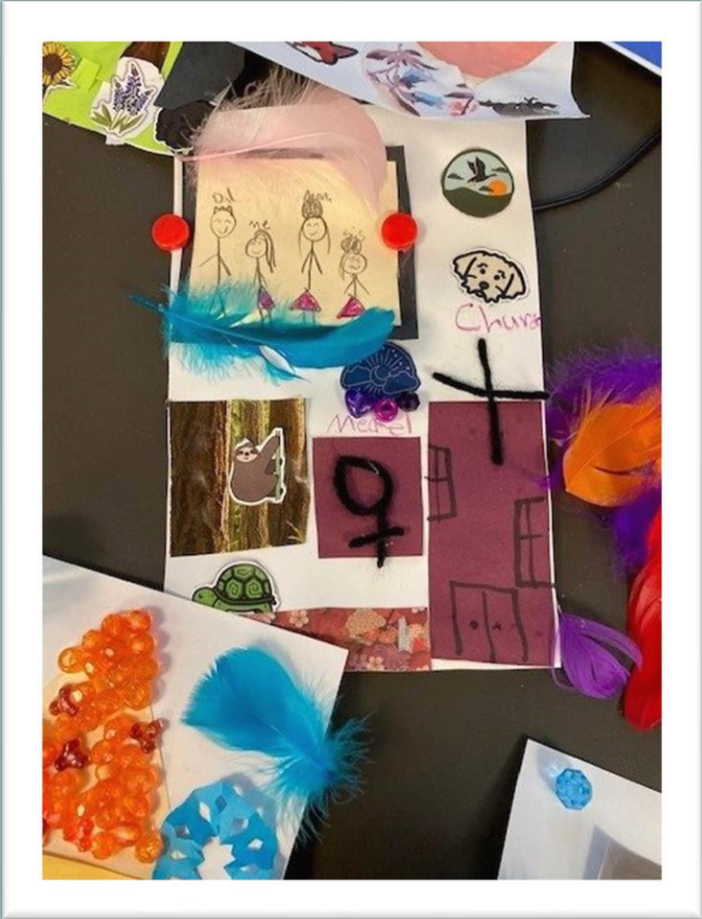
Designed for students in grade 4, **Sharing Our Story** addresses the history of Washington state and tribal sovereignty by exploring how society and historical movements influenced Northwest artists. Students learn about two artists and how an artist's life is reflected in their artwork. Students then consider how history has impacted their own lives and create art based on their own lives.

**Building Blocks of Art** explores art concepts utilized by Northwest artists as tools of expression. Each grade focuses on a different art element or principle of design used by Northwest artists. Students are introduced to an art concept, explore Northwest art using their art concept, and then create their own art.

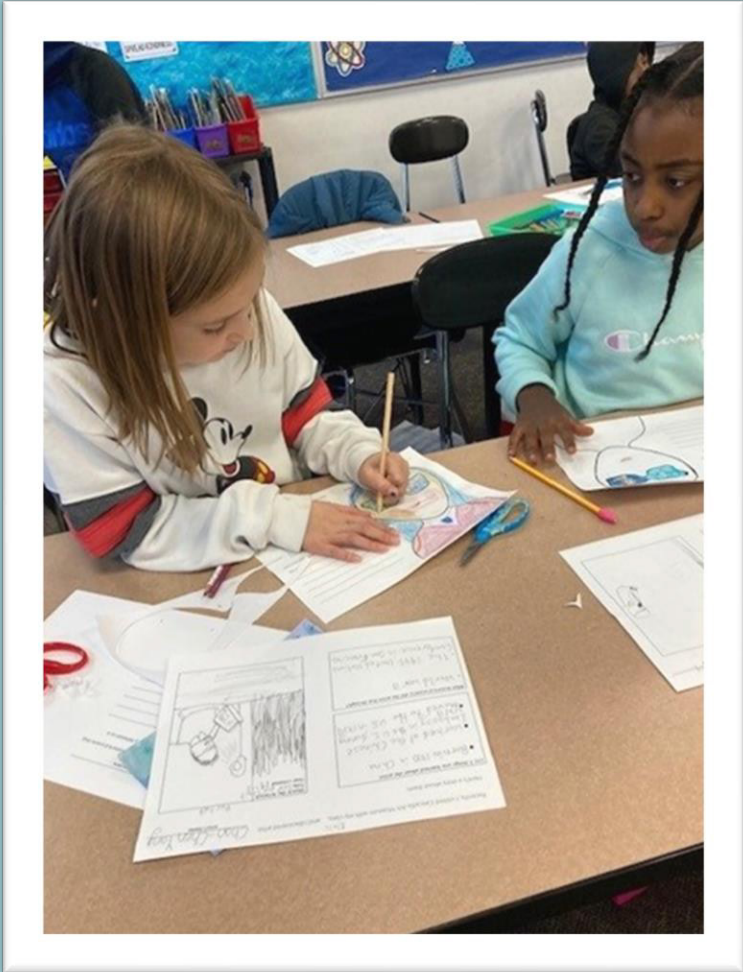
# Achievements
