Volunteer Services is committed to helping elders and adults with disabilities remain independent in their own homes through a network of caring community members. The services are provided at no charge and serve as a safety net for those individuals who cannot afford to pay for assistance and do not qualify for other assistance.

In the 12-month period from May 1, 2025 to April 30, 2026, Volunteer Services' volunteers provided 357 unique clients help in tasks such as light housework, laundry, organizing the home, yard work, grocery shopping and transportation to important medical appointments. Volunteers spent almost 18,000 hours helping their neighbors during that timeframe.

One-on-one matches of volunteers to clients continues to be the heart of the Volunteer Services program. In our annual client survey, clients shared just how much of a difference their volunteer made: "My volunteer has been a real live-saver for me. She does more than I expected and is always helpful and kind." "(My volunteer) has been a God-send. I told her that before. There are things I wouldn't be able to do without her. She's an inspiration." "It elevates my mood when (my volunteer) comes over."

Another way for clients to receive help from Volunteer Services is through group service projects. Many times, these are projects where the client is not able to keep up with all the yard work that needs to be done and the yard will get out of control. A group, ranging from 5 to 50 volunteers will go to a client's home and provide services for a few hours. One example that occurred in January was a group of about 40 going to two different homes to help with clearing blackberries, getting the grass under control and other heavy yard work. The picture shows what a difference was made in a morning of work!
