Catholic Housing Services – Josephinum Apartments

The Josephinum Services Team is comprised of 1 FTE Clinical Supervisor, 1 FTE Case Manager, 1 FTE Hygiene Specialist, 1 Event Coordinator shared with Christ Our Hope parish located in the Josephinum. Through our expanded Services Team, the Josephinum has increased our ability to assist residents with a variety of needs.

The Metrics we have chosen to report on are related to Services for the Homeless. For the extremely low income and homeless people that we serve, "stable housing" is equated with successful and long-term tenancy in CHS affordable housing complexes. Through the supportive services we provide, residents receive counseling about financial management, education opportunities, job training programs, healthcare services, and the basic life skills that go into successfully maintaining a stable home. Of the 221 units of housing, 154 of those residents will be in need of some support and 22 new residents were the focus of the housing metrics submitted.

Specific goals include:

- Increased resident stability -- 80% of our residents receiving supportive services will maintain their housing for 6 months; and of those 75% will maintain their housing for 1 year.
 - 100% of the 22 previously homeless/zero/low income residents who moved into the
 Josephinum 6 months ago have maintained housing for 6 months. Of the 23 total move-ins
 during 2018, 1 person passed away and 1 person was unable to tolerate housing,
 abandoning their unit and returning to homelessness.
- Greater Self Determination -- 85% of residents receiving services will create a housing service plan that outline self-identified goals related to housing stability; and 60% of the residents that have a housing services plan will achieve at least one self-identified goal within the first year.
 - 1. 19 residents created a service plan with our Services Staff, 16 identified 1 or more goals related to housing stability. Of the 16 residents who identified 1 or more goals, all 16 achieved 1 or more self-identified goals on the service plan.
- Increased Skills/Income -- 95% of residents that enter permanent housing without an income will be referred to resources within 6 months; and 75% of residents will engage in a mainstream community activity within the first 6 months.
 - 1. 3 of the 22 total resident move-ins during 2018 were identified as having 0 income; all 3 were referred to resources within the first 6 months. All 3 are awaiting SS benefits as they are unable to return to work. They have been connected to DSHS and are receiving cash and food benefits while they await the outcome of the SS application process. 15 residents enjoyed a day at Woodland Park Zoo, 4 residents enjoyed a free glass blowing exhibit, 2 were referred and enrolled in Path With Art and 1 was referred to the ASSET program, a return to work program of CCS.
