

Thank you for the generous \$█████ grant to Providence General Children's Association.

These funds, along with all of the proceeds from our annual Teddy Bear Celebration (and our year-round PGCA fundraising efforts) benefit the healthcare needs of children in our community.

This year, we are celebrating our 75th Anniversary and are particularly proud of our legacy and the enduring impact we have made on children.

The Tulalip Charitable funds will be utilized to support Camp Prov, an integrated day camp for children with special needs and their siblings. Founded by Providence General Children's Association and Providence Children's Center in 1996, the camp pairs children with special healthcare needs such as autism, traumatic brain injury and sensory disorders with student volunteers for games, crafts, singing, nature walks and the wildly popular splash pad. Camp is held for five weeks in the summer with two sessions each day, serving hundreds of children.

Along with supporting Camp Prov, PGCA volunteers also raise money to help babies born prematurely, children who have been abused and teens who are homeless. We support reading, student hygiene and clothing programs, offer scholarships and help feed kids who suffer from food insecurity.
