Program Update

The mission of the Community Resource Center of Stanwood-Camano is to administer and cultivate programs that foster a healthy community. The resource center provides a teen center for our community's teens. At Davis Place Teen Center our volunteers and staff offer teens a safe and supportive place to engage in their community. Through our programs we strive to help teens improve their social and emotional development, to increase protective factors and to empower youth to contribute to positive change in their community. Our afterschool program provides drop-in services, homework help with volunteer tutors, STEAM classes as well as community service.

Our teen center received funding for September 1, 2019 – August 31, 2020 and during the that time our teen center provided the following to our community teens:

- Classes: Day of Coding 10-part series, Beginning Guitar Class, Youth Sewing Class, Art Classes – 8 part series, Card Making for Children's Hospital, Jam Session with Snohomish County Music Project
- Drop-in Activities – varies, but consists of cooking,
- Tutoring on Tuesdays & Thursdays
- Lego Robotics Club, led by Stanwood Camano High School Student
- Meals during drop-in and tutoring

During this funding period we began work on our community teen program collaboration – Stanwood Camano Youth Partnership. The Stanwood Camano Youth Partnership, also known as SCYP (pronounced “skip”), is a community collaborative working to engage community relationships so all of our youth can connect with their power, purpose, and passion in life. Our collaborative partners consist of the following agencies:

- The Community Resource Center of Stanwood and Camano (CRC-SC)
- Stanwood Camano YMCA
- The Spot/ Youth Dynamics
- Stanwood and Camano Island Libraries
- Safe Harbor Free Clinic
- Stanwood-Camano School District

This year our work has focused primarily on identifying strategic goals and organizational structure. We identified the following as our focus areas:

- Community Engagement
- Access to Resources
- Mental and Physical Health
- Empowering Youth Voice and Opportunities

In addition to our strategic work we also identified the need to centralize how parents and the community learn about our teen services. SCYP received a small grant and was able to build a website: [www. scyp teens.org](http://www.scyp teens.org). The Community Resource Center provides the staff person who leads this collaborative in addition to their work coordinating and leading our in-house teens services for the community.

This funding cycle was also significantly impacted by COVID-19. In March 2020 we had to begin offering all our program in a virtual capacity to comply with state and health department regulations. However, our Teen Coordinator was able to quickly adapt and find creative ways to provide services via Facebook Live, Zoom and through other virtual platforms.

Outputs

We survey our teens throughout the year to determine the impact of our programs. We expect our interventions with teens to help them develop pro-social behaviors and improve their social and emotional development. During this funding period (Sept 1 – Aug 31, 2020) our teens reported the following:

- ❖ **100% Reported Increased Protective Factors for Youth.**
 - Teens report that spending time at Davis Place provides them the opportunity to interact positively with others.
- ❖ **100% Reported Feeling Empowered to Contribute to Positive Change in their Community.**
 - Teens reported that through Davis Place they were provided an opportunity to get involved in their community.

Agency Statement

Our teen center, Davis Place has been a program of the resource center since 2008. Many of our teen center volunteers have been with us since its inception and they continue their work because of their passion for teens. The teens that visit our center come from all socio-economic backgrounds but they all desire and benefit from the positive interactions they have with our caring staff and volunteers. Because of the financial support we receive directly from our community members, churches, and local foundations, like Tulalip Tribe Charitable Contributions, we are also able to provide all our teen programming free of charge. This allows us to include not exclude teens that are interested in our services and ensure that our community teens have somewhere they can go where they feel included, respected and where they can belong.
