Thank you for your contribution of \$ [REDACTED] to Coupeville Farm to School. Per our application, funding was used to support the costs of our program in the 2021/2022 academic year for all 1,000 students at Coupeville Elementary, Middle, and High Schools. Activities included School Gardens, Cooking Classes, and Educational Activities. The School Farm continues to expand its operations, and is in near constant use for the production of fresh, nutritious produce for our students as well as outdoor educational activities for the students.

The Middle School Garden project is taking longer than we anticipated, but we have had two large scale volunteer days to break ground, remove what was already existing there, replace five yards of garden soil, and start with native planting. Next steps for the next six months are getting irrigation in place and pathways laid out. We hope that within that time teachers at the Middle and High School will be bringing their students to the new garden space for classes related to science, environment, and nutrition.

From Maja, 4th Grade, "I like the school garden. I think it makes the kids more aware of where your food comes from and how much work goes into preparing the food you eat. When you can understand where the food you're eating is coming from, and you know what the ingredients are, it usually means it's better for you."
