Thank you for your contribution of [REDACTED] to Coupeville Farm to School. Per our application, funding was used to support the operating costs for our program during the 2023/2024 academic year for almost all 1,000 students at Coupeville Elementary, Middle, and High Schools. Activities included working in the Elementary School Gardens, Cooking Classes, Educational Activities, planning of the Middle School gardens, participation in the Middle School Sustainability classroom, and this summer we will be hosting our first ever teen camp. The School Farm continues to expand its operations, and is in near constant use for the production of fresh, nutritious produce for our students as well as outdoor educational activities for the students.

The Middle School Garden project is finally taking shape as students in the Middle School sustainability class have worked to clear a space to create a moveable garden grid. This will be utilized with mobile potted plants for math and science classes. The next steps over the summer will include laying the pavers for the “garden graph”, potting the plants that will be a mix of edible plants and plants which can be utilized in the art classes, and finally turning the remaining space into a literary and pollinator garden.

This summer we will be hosting our first ever “Sustainable Skills Teen Camp” which will focus on gardening, cooking, baking, food preservation, and animal husbandry. This camp is open to Middle and High School students. The School Farm will also be open throughout the summer for “Family days.” We are thankful that your funding has allowed us to expand our programming.
