We would like to thank everyone who contributed and helped make these wonder events happen. It is with pleasure that I send you this update of how your funds were used to enhance the lives of our Crossroads students: **Report Q4 2018 14.2**

The funds were used to for the students of Crossroads High School to have their first project based learning experience, participate in drum making, and go to Hibulb Cultural Center. A totals of 150 Crossroads students were positively impacted from the help of Tulalip Charitable Contributions.

There were 30 students, including one Tulalip Tribal member, participated in drum making. All 150 students when on the field trip the Hibulb Cultural Center. The students were highly engaged in learning about the traditions of a fellow student and neighboring community.



The project based learning experience had 115 students participate. The theme was Indigenous People. Students selected a tribe or experience to research and create projects around. They were able to earn credit in different academic areas, based on their work. The project ended with a cultural celebration. Members from the Tulalip Tribe and the neighboring communities attended. The students shared their projects, drumming was taught, and a feast was provided.



The primary goals/outcomes were to increase the positive experiences for the students and thus connecting them more to school. Because of your help, our attendance has increased, and students reported an increase in the value of what they were learning and doing in school. We plan to continue project based learning next year because you allowed us the opportunity to show our students the value of education.

We extend our deepest appreciation to the Tulalip Tribes for providing funding so we were able to achieve our goals and bringing these positive experiences to out at-risk youths.
