ANNUAL REPORT 2018-19

The 2019 DeMiero Jazz Festival kicked off with a special Thursday intensive day and student-focused concert on March 7th, and enjoyed two more days of workshops and concerts on March 8th and 9th, 2018. This year was our 43rd annual vocal jazz festival.

We served 1,100 students, along with choir directors, family and friends from 60 elementary school, middle school, high school, college, and community jazz choirs. 955 people attended evening concerts, and over 80 volunteers and 12 clinicians and guest artists came together to make the Festival a success.

Professional jazz singers and instrumentalists offered daytime clinics and evening concerts to the students and interested members of the public. This year's headliners were jazz vocalists Johnaye Kendrick, Michael Mayo, and the vocal trio Duchess. Clinicians included longtime Seattle jazz singer Greta Matassa and renowned teacher Dave Barduhn. In addition, a band of well-known jazz players backed up both professional and student soloists and offered inspiration to the instrumentalists that accompanied the choirs.




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Student groups performed for clinicians during the day and received feedback and suggestions. They also observed and participated in solo clinics and master classes, and provided a supportive audience for their peers' performances. Ten committed high school choirs participated in the Thursday Music Intensive, where they worked hard all day and were mentored by our guest artists and clinicians, and then they performed for the public on Thursday night. Because the DeMiero Jazz Festival is non-competitive, there were no trophies, but everyone was a winner. Personal insight, growth, and new excitement about jazz styles and performing all went home with every participant.

An exciting addition this year was an evening performance by Dee Daniels scholarship winner Kimi Locke, a high school student. Kimi was mentored by Artistic Director Sara Gazarek and had the chance to perform at all three concerts with the all-star rhythm section.

Venues:

The Festival took over the Edmonds Center for the Arts for daytime and evening programming, and also offered clinics and performances at North Sound Community Church, Holy Trinity Church, and the North Sound Conference Center.



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Community Impact:

With more than 2,000 people visiting Edmonds and Lynnwood, the economic impact can be measured in restaurant meals, shopping, and hotel stays. The cultural impact of dedicated student singers and their directors is harder to measure, but as local residents stroll past the open doors of the free daytime programming, they are drawn in and captured by the warmth, the energy, and the professionalism of the Jazz Festival participants. The evening concerts drew enthusiastic crowds and inspired all our guest artists to perform from the heart.

New Artistic Director:

We are thrilled to work with our new Artistic Director, Sara Gazarek, a rising jazz artist and a faculty member at the University of Southern California. Sara is a native of the Seattle area and is working closely with Frank DeMiero to design the next several years of the Festival.

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Financial Year 2018-2019

The DeMiero Jazz Festival is a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization, dedicated to providing world class jazz experiences through education, clinics, and performances. It is funded through a combination of fees for services and tax-deductible donations from supporters. 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In-Kind Donations and Volunteer Support

In-Kind Donations in 2018-19 included: \$1,500 in vehicle rentals for artists during the festival, \$4,000 in donated rental sound equipment, and \$500 in airline miles for artist transportation.
