2014 Educational Accomplishments

EMERGING YOUNG LEADERS

In 2014, Dynamic Urban Opportunities Foundation (DUOF) provided financial support for the Foundation's chapter of Emerging Young Leaders (EYL). The Seattle area EYL program, included 30 girls grades sixth through eighth and provided leadership development, civic engagement, enhanced academic preparation and character building training over the duration of the academic school year.

EMERGING YOUNG LEADERS YOUTH SUMMIT

In an effort to positively impact youth in the Puget Sound area, the Foundation partnered with the Puget Sound and Pierce County chapters of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated to host the EYL Community Youth Summit, on Saturday, March 1, 2014 at the Tukwila Community Center. 85 sixth thru eighth graders attended and had an opportunity to interact with STEM professionals – as well as participate in hands-on learning activities.

In addition to the parents, 50 parents and guardians also attended the summit. They participated in a parallel program taking place in conjunction with the student activities, during which they received tips for keeping their student(s) interested in STEM subjects, discussed educational funding, exposed to grant and scholarship opportunities, and received information about projected career and earning potential for STEM professionals.

DOUGLAS TRUTH LIBRARY TEA

In 1964, the Negro Life and History Collection began with 352 books purchased Delta Upsilon Omega. The continued support of the sorority and the community has created the finest what was then the Yesler Library's "Negro Life and History Collection" in the State of Washington and has earned Seattle Public Libraries, Douglass-Truth Branch, located at 23rd and Yesler, major regional recognition as a resource which provides in-depth materials on the Black experience in the United States with emphasis on the Pacific Northwest. .

On September 28, 2014, the Library celebrated the 50th anniversary of the African-American History Collection with a (not sure we should say annual) Library Tea. The event was attended by over 40 guests and DUOF presented the Library with a donation of \$1,908 to support the continuation of the collection.

COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED

In 2014, DUOF awarded \$6,000 in scholarship awards, two \$2,500 scholarships to graduating high school seniors and one \$1,000 scholarship to an undergraduate at the University of Washington.
