Emergency Food Network (EFN) is grateful for the generous support we received from the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions in 2024. Please accept this report as requested for the grant of [REDACTED] received on January 7, 2025; Code: Q3 2024 14.2. Funds from the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions supported EFN's Co-op Food Purchasing Program, which provided more than 2.5 million pounds of nutritious food to our Partner Programs in 2024.

Your support helped EFN distribute more than 13.8 million pounds of food in total in 2024, enabling our network of 75+ partner food pantries, meal sites, and shelters to serve 3.1 million guest visits. This marks the highest demand in our 42-year history and reflects a statewide trend: according to WSDA food assistance data, one in four Washington residents visited a food pantry in fiscal year 2024—up from one in seven before the pandemic. To help meet this growing need, EFN utilized every available avenue to get food to our partners.

The Co-op Food Purchasing Program is a vital component of our strategy. We spent \$1.1 million on staple foods, including rice, oats, pasta, fresh produce, canned fruits and vegetables, and frozen proteins to stock the shelves of our Partner Programs. Despite record-high demand, 93% of our Partner Programs reported that they were able to maintain an adequate food supply. Support from the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund was instrumental in EFN's ability to distribute nutritious staples and feed our hungry neighbors.
