Dear Members of the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund:

Our report on the grant we received in September 2023 is a little late, but we are no less grateful for your support of our project to renovate the Backyard Garden in the Evergreen Arboretum and Gardens. We requested funds to help us complete the hardscape phase of the renovation of the Backyard Garden. This area is popular as a gathering spot for family celebrations including weddings and engagements, but as the garden has aged it was less inviting and more difficult for our volunteers to manage. Previous grants and a design project with an Edmonds College landscape design class have brought us to a strong, new design featuring a large patio area designed to look like the crosscut stump of an old tree and several benches shaped to look as if they were carved from rocks. Additional features now include a dry creek bed and a bubbler fountain.

It took us longer than we had hoped to get drainage and irrigation work completed, but as we begin 2025, the Backyard Garden is nearing completion and Tulalip grant funds have been expended. As stated above, we used your grant to help complete the hardscape. This is the largest project the Arboretum has undertaken, and a summary of the budget, as it relates to the Tulalip Charitable Trust grant, is below.


