Dear Marilyn,

I'm excited to share our impact report regarding the grant from the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions Fund (Q2 2025 14.2) that supported the delivery of our Adult Basic Education (ABE) Program at our Snohomish County Job Training and Education Center (JTEC). Since 2006, the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund has provided Evergreen Goodwill of Northwest Washington (EGNW) with essential support for our tuition-free ABE programs focusing on Job Skills Training and Education, Digital Literacy and Access, and High School Completion. Your support continues to help those most vulnerable in our communities develop the skills needed to find and maintain employment to support themselves and their families. Across our five-county service area, we've been able to serve a total of 5,498 students this fiscal year.

Between July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2026, our 2026 fiscal year, your grant of [REDACTED] helped support critical staffing needs at our Snohomish JTEC. There has been an increasing demand for our ABE classes and services in Snohomish County since 2024 as identified by our Community Needs Assessment. This fiscal year we experienced a 26% increase in enrollment with 630 students enrolled across 57 classes, compared to 500 students the year before. We've

served 1,276 students in total between our Snohomish JTEC and Marysville Community Classroom with classes, workshops, labs, and wraparound services focused on GED preparation and high school completion, digital skills training, career navigation, and more. We also surpassed our job placement and education goals with 160 students placed in jobs averaging \$23.06/hr and 148 students receiving education placements in college certificate, vocational training, apprenticeship, and two-year programs across local community colleges and other academic or technical institutions.



We are proud to report that our services supported members of the Tulalip Tribes including continuing partnerships with the Tulalip Vocational Training Center (TVTC), Tulalip Employment Rights Office (TERO), Tribal Youth Programs and Tulalip Homeless Shelter, where we have been able to provide job

readiness workshops for over 10 years. This year, we participated in TERO Transition Day, where we delivered our “Dressing for an Interview”, “How to Succeed in the Workplace” and “Budgeting” workshops, and offered digital skills classes at the Tulalip Tribe’s senior living facility.



We are honored by our 20-year partnership with the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions and are grateful for your continued support. Through numerous program partnerships and continued collaboration, past and present, your investment has helped keep Goodwill programs free and accessible for

over 100 years. Together, we empower individuals furthest from economic opportunities to gain skills, secure employment, support their families, and enrich their communities. With your support, EGNW continues advancing our mission as a leading provider of tuition-free adult education and job placement in Northwest Washington.
