Overview

EvergreenHealth Hospice Care extends its deepest gratitude to the **Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions**Program for the generous Community Grant supporting our Grief and Bereavement Program. This funding allows us to continue providing compassionate support for individuals and families navigating loss—offering connection, understanding, and healing during life's most vulnerable times.

The Grief and Bereavement Program is a **non-compensated service** offered to bereaved families for **13 months following the loss of a loved one**. This program provides an essential continuum of care, ensuring that families are supported well beyond the end of hospice services.

Program Impact (May - October 2025)

Bereavement Outreach

• **6,973 letters and cards sent** — including condolence cards, Rose Garden mailings, and bereavement letters at 1, 3, 6, 9, and 11 months following a loss.

Individual Support

- 62 one-on-one counseling sessions provided by trained grief counselors.
- 964 supportive phone calls offering guidance, comfort, and resources.

Group Support

- Our bereavement services continue to provide meaningful support for individuals and families
 navigating loss. Over the past year, we've offered a variety of group sessions and special programs
 designed to foster connection, healing, and reflection. In total, we held 54 sessions and served
 approximately 420 participants through the following offerings:
- Programs included:
 - 1. **Grief 101** 6 sessions, averaging 15 participants per session (≈90 total)
 - 2. Parent Loss Support Group 1 session, 12 participants
 - Till Death Do Us Part 19 sessions, averaging 8 participants per session (≈152 total)
 - 4. Navigating Through Grief 6 sessions, averaging 8 participants per session (≈48 total)
 - 5. Mindfulness Meditation 6 sessions, averaging 1 participant per session (≈6 total)
 - Support for Family Members 16 sessions, averaging 2 participants per session (≈32 total)
 - 7. Rose Garden Memorial Ceremony 200 participants

Total: 54 sessions | ≈420 participants

Community Reach

Between May and October 2025, our bereavement services reached **approximately 8,200 individuals and families** through letters, phone calls, counseling sessions, and group programs. Each touchpoint represents a moment of care, compassion and connection, helping our community find comfort and meaning after loss.

Use of Funds

Funding from the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions Program directly supported:

- Program materials and grief literature
- Postage for outreach mailings
- Supplies for support group facilitation

These resources ensure that families continue to receive compassionate follow-up and emotional support—no matter where they are in their grief journey.
