On behalf of Girl Scouts of Western Washington (GSWW), thank you for your generous [REDACTED] grant in support of our Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, Racial Justice, and Belonging (DEIRJ-B) programs in 2025. Your investment directly helped remove barriers to participation for the youth who need Girl Scouts most across western Washington. The Girl Scouts Leadership Experience provides the framework that generates the leadership outcomes that build Girl Scouts of courage, confidence, and character.

With support from the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions Fund, GSWW was able to continue three core programs serving underserved youth:

- Our Financial Assistance program awarded \$320,130 in grants to 2,560 Girl Scouts, covering camp and program fees, membership dues, uniforms, supplies, and troop activities so that no girl had to miss out due to cost. Five hundred and forty-five Girl Scouts in Snohomish County received financial assistance, averaging \$125 per youth.
- Our Affinity Camps, including Pride Camp for LGBTQ+ Girl Scouts and Umoja Camp for Black and African American Girl Scouts and their families, served 225 campers last summer.
- Our Girl Scouts Beyond Bars program continued its 25-year legacy connecting youth with justice-involved family members inside Washington State correctional facilities, providing troops that meet inside the prison and continue as community troops after release.

In 2025 we served 14,023 Girl Scout members in our service area, with approximately 2,520 in Snohomish County. During the year, our BIPOC membership grew from 28% to 31% as we worked towards matching Washington State's 39% BIPOC youth population. LGBTQ+ youth participation remained around 35%, and Girl Scouts from low-to-moderate income households remained around 20%. Approximately 24% of our members live in rural communities.

Your partnership makes this work possible. We are grateful for the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions Fund's ongoing commitment to building a stronger, more equitable community for young people in western Washington. Thank you for investing in the next generation of leaders.
