TERO Construction Training Center would like to extend our sincere gratitude of your generous contribution made to our program.

This quarter we had 19 native students start our winter session and 16 complete the entire program. Our training staff met with the Port of Seattle and numerous contractors, as three pre-apprentice opportunities are being offered for upcoming multi-billion dollar projects located at Sea-Tac and the Port. Our site coordinator followed up with personal e-mails to the new contacts made, to establish open lines of communication. They also toured South Seattle Community College which has its own Trades Instruction Training program, and will look to implement some successful things seen there into our own.

Our spring session will be focusing on the units that's were not held in the fall and winter, so students will be invited back for this program.

Next fall is when we expect to see most of our exciting changes. Rather than have three sessions per year, we will instead have two full terms, expected to last approximately four months each. We will be reaching out to unions making arrangements for workshops to be brought to our center. This will ensure our students are being taught the most current procedures being performed in the work place.

Another new implementation is fitness, ensuring the students that complete our course will have a stronger chance for success in the construction field. We also hope to encourage our students to further their reach; to look beyond the reservation, discover confidence in themselves, and to recognize that this is within their grasp.
