As we work to meet the needs of our families, we are strengthened by supporters who provide critical funding for these services. Please accept this letter as our final report.



In October 2019, HopeWorks hosted a community ribboncutting event that welcomed over 400 friends, funders, neighbors into the and completed Kindred Kitchen and Station Place apartments for families and individuals experiencing homelessness. HopeWorks Station's first floor is home to Kindred Kitchen, a freshly branded expansion of CafeWorks. HopeWorks' youth barista training program. In its new

home, Kindred Kitchen provides a robust culinary training program, where interns gain skills required for successful employment in the food-service industry. This space includes a full culinary production kitchen where interns develop skills in making breakfast items, soups, sandwiches, and salads all from scratch. The facility will double the number of participants the organization can serve, and also provide a much richer job training experience that will prepare interns to secure career pathway employment in a variety of positions in the foodservice industry.

Interns enrolling from affordable housing sites will have access to the ground floor training academy spaces. These classroom facilities can accommodate groups of 15 to 50 and will host a variety of employment training activities. Kindred Kitchen staff will use

the space to train new internship participants in the hard and soft skills necessary to be successful in that enterprise.
