Tulalip Tribe Charitable Fund Grant Report

We are grateful for the support of the received in June of 2015. We also appreciate your flexibility in postponing our reporting requirement for the grant, as our year-end reports from the schools are not due until June 30th.

We are delighted to share that in 2015-16 InvestED, thanks in part to your gift, InvestED helped 23,240 students in 652 schools with \$849,177 in total program support statewide, representing an 11% increase in the number of students served since last year and establishing a new record for the organization.

We would like to share this story received from the InvestED coordinator at Interagency Academy in Seattle, as it illustrates in a few heartfelt words, the impact the InvestED Program makes on the individual lives of the students in our state:

Your program is phenomenal, in all areas of students' lives that it reaches. I am not sure if you're familiar with the population that we serve, but a lot of students come from single parent homes and some are even homeless. Your program allows us to provide students with basic hygiene items. We put on a monthly breakfast meal for the students that gives them the only hot meal they might receive that month. Because we view our students as important, we celebrate their birthdays by issuing gift cards to local Subway restaurants. This allows them to be viewed as significant in our eyes, even when their families forget about them.

Mission Statement

InvestED helps Washington state secondary school students in need by granting them opportunities to achieve. We provide basic supplies and access to school programs, and other assistance to give students the chance to reach their true potential.

Helping students get to school, stay in school and graduate from school: Our Unique Approach

- The help is immediate and is available at school when the student needs it
- The help is confidential
- The help is individualized

Partnering with schools statewide: How the InvestED Program Works

- Each August, InvestED provides initial program funding to partner schools. The amount for each school is determined by using a customized algorithm based on the number of students eligible for free and reduced lunch and other relevant factors.
- During the school year, school personnel trained as InvestED coordinators access their fund to help individual students in need. Funds can be used for items and opportunities, such as activity fees, equipment for music or sports, transportation, field trips, clothing and more. (See additional info on back)
- InvestED encourages local fundraising efforts with a "Challenge Matching" program and offers an "Adopt-A-School" program to support individual schools.
- In June, InvestED coordinators provide a detailed report on how the money was spent and other program data. They also share student-recipient stories that illustrate the impact of the InvestED Program on the individual lives of students in our state.


More than fifty years of providing immediate help for students in need: Our History

In 1963, Saul Haas (owner and founder of KIRO Radio and Television) had a daughter at Garfield High School and discovered that the critical needs of many low income students were not being met, jeopardizing their ability to stay in school. He began to donate to Garfield and other schools, eventually founding the Saul and Dayee G. Haas Foundation in 1972. In 2009, the foundation transitioned to public charity status and adopted the name InvestED.
