

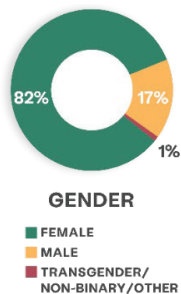

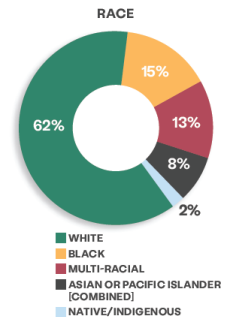
Our sincere gratitude to the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions. The tribe's gift to KCSARC has been instrumental in the healing journey for survivors in our community.

BY THE NUMBERS

Since 2017, we have seen a 17% increase in the number of survivors we serve. **In 2023, 4,805 survivors** and their families accessed direct services at King County Sexual Assault Resource Center, **45% of which were under the age of 18**. Overall, in 2023, through direct in-person prevention education and indirect online outreach, resources, and information about sexual assault were accessed by more than **53,176 individuals** in the community.



Of the clients in 2023 who self-identified, **82% were female, 17% were male, and 1% were transgender or nonbinary**. And though sexual violence cuts across socioeconomic lines, of the clients we serve who shared their income, approximately **73%, self-identified as being from low to very low-income families**. Of those who self-identified, **25% were Latinx and 15% identified as African American, 8% Asian, 13% multi-racial, 2% Indigenous, and 62% Caucasian**.



KCSARC services continue to be available to all who reside within or were assaulted within King County and cost is never a barrier to receiving services. Services are provided in nearly every city in the region: **32% from Seattle, 22% from East/North King County, and 46% from South King County**. KCSARC continues to maintain offices in Renton (primary office), Federal Way (at the Health Department), and Redmond (Evergreen Health).

A STORY OF RESILIENCE

Julie (names in this story have been changed to protect confidentiality) is the mom of a teenage girl who was sexually assaulted by a peer in the 8th grade. Her daughter had been struggling with school and her self-esteem, so her mom called the KCSARC 24-hour Resource Line at the recommendation of the school counselor. Her daughter was not open to services at the time, but Julie and her husband, Sam, wanted more information on how to best support their daughter. Sam was saddened to see their daughter's typical cheerful demeanor turn into a depressive state. The Resource Line Advocate let them know that KCSARC's Family Services program was the perfect match for their current needs. In just a couple of days, they received a call from a Parent Educator. During their first session, they were assured that their love and support would carry their daughter a long way in her healing process. They learned about the impact of sexual assault on a teen, the most common offender traits and behaviors, boundaries and respect, and some possible ways to engage their daughter in a conversation. After eight sessions, they reported that their daughter seemed open to therapy and was planning to call on her own to schedule an appointment.
