Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions:

On behalf of LGBTQ Allyship, thank you to Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions for your contribution of [REDACTED]. Your contribution along with support from individuals, companies, foundations, the City of Seattle and King County resulted in the following efforts in 2022. Our economic justice program teamed up with the Fair Work Center to engage food service workers about their rights for secure scheduling, fair pay, and advocating for a fair tip system. We connected 1-on-1 with over **20 workers** about their worker rights and reached over **3,000 workers** through our social media.

Our housing justice program we are teamed with Stay Housed, Stay Healthy coalition to help pass renter protections for residents of the King County region, including Burien, Tukwila, Kenmore, Redmond, and Kirkland. We are not stopping this year as we push for more cities to protect their renters and keep those most vulnerable housed. We connected with over **1,500 renters** through our social media messaging and videos and provided 1-on-1 support to over **15 renters** to ensure their rights were not being violated.

With all the recent attacks on the LGBTQIA+ community – especially trans and nonbinary young adults – LGBTQ Allyship is offering our Talk Gender to Me Training to deepen the diversity and inclusion education of local companies and institutions. The training provides foundational knowledge of sexual orientation and gender identity; increases awareness and understanding of transgender and non-binary employees within the workplace; and strengthens the ability of participants to apply the skills to foster transgender-affirming environments. In 2022, established program curriculum and **completed the training for two large organizations, educating over 500 employees between both companies.**

LGBTQ Allyship is known for being a great community-building organization. We plan to expand our work throughout King County this year as we continue to champion the priorities of the LGBTQIA+ and BIPOC communities. We are doing that this year by expanding our reach by bringing LGBTQIA+-led organizations and ally organizations to make a bigger and stronger impact. When we work together, we strengthen our voice and power to make the system changes needed for and by the community.
