Lynette and her children lived at LifeWire's Emergency Housing Shelter: My Sister's Home. They now have their own apartment and are building a new life in safety, free of violence.

Domestic violence is pervasive and impacts thousands of families throughout our community, regardless of age, gender identity, sexual orientation, economic status, race, religion, nationality or educational background. More than 1 in 4 women and more than 1 in 7 men have experienced sexual violence, physical violence or stalking by an intimate partner. One in 3 American youth age 14-20 has been a victim of dating violence. Children's exposure to domestic violence and abuse frequently results in emotional and behavioral problems throughout childhood and into adulthood.

LifeWire's mission is to end domestic violence by changing individual, institutional and societal beliefs, attitudes and behaviors that perpetuate it. In the past 35 years LifeWire has developed groundbreaking and lifesaving programs serving more than 136,000 survivors and their children. Through housing, advocacy, counseling and outreach programs, LifeWire assists families who have experienced physical, emotional or sexual abuse and works to prevent domestic violence through community prevention education. We strive to change the culture that tolerates domestic violence while assisting survivors in healing and becoming self-sufficient.
