On behalf of the Medic One Foundation Board of Directors, I am very pleased to share this brief report on the successful completion of our 2019 grant from Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund.

Thanks to your generous support, Solomon Wilson, our Marysville Fire District student, has graduated from our region's world-class Paramedic Training Program! Solomon has returned to the Marysville Fire District and is working in the field saving lives in your community as a paramedic. Enclosed are a few photos of Solomon during his training and one at graduation. Let me know if you'd like these photos electronically.

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Paramedic Training Program had to make many changes mid-year, once COVID-19 precautions were required. Some training events were rescheduled for the late spring/early summer, social distancing required adjustments to classroom time and class size, and some lectures were done online for remote viewing. Every effort was made to balance the risk of COVID-19 with the need to complete Solomon's education. And they did so successfully!

Over the year, Solomon:

- **Received over 2,750 hours of instruction** from physicians who are University of Washington faculty. The national recommendation is 1,100 hours. ***This quality and quantity of instruction led to Solomon's final exam test score of 92% - truly exceptional.***
- Acquired very extensive training in the field under the direct supervision of experienced paramedics. ***Solomon had over 500 patient contacts—three times the national average. He also performed more than 255 IVs and 17 intubations, two of the many difficult skills he successfully mastered. During the 10-month training program, he also led treatment for 5 cardiac arrest victims.***

Thank you for making Solomon's extensive training possible and helping to save more lives in your community. If you would like to visit with Solomon, virtually of course, to hear about his journey to become a paramedic, I would be pleased to arrange for him to attend a virtual meeting or gathering. You'll be so proud of Solomon—he is truly world-class!
