On behalf of the Board of Trustees and staff at Museum of Glass, thank you again for the grant of from the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund (Q4201414.2) in support of the Museum's 2015 School Visit Program. In 2015, Museum of Glass served 5,263 area students, 20% of whom participated free of charge thanks to donors like Tulalip Tribes.

Students participating in the School Visit Program are engaged in their own classrooms before and after the visit through a Museum of Glass curriculum that introduces artistic concepts in alignment with Washington State educational standards. These standards include the study of line, shape, form, color, value, texture and space, as well as the principles of design. Design principles include repetition and pattern, contrast, emphasis and dominance, variety, balance, movement and rhythm, proportion, harmony and unity.

Once students arrive at Museum of Glass, they spend three hours at the Museum touring the galleries, watching glass art being created in the Museum Hot Shop (where their questions are welcomed), and then having the opportunity to create their own artwork in the Museum's Studio. Their art projects align with the exhibitions on view in the galleries and reinforce the concepts mentioned above.


The Museum of Glass School Visit Program has become an invaluable and welcomed time of student enrichment in area schools where the teaching of state-mandated art principles is now left up to individual teachers who must find a way to incorporate the arts while still ensuring that their students perform well on state-mandated tests.

The gift from the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund enabled Museum of Glass to host 333 students from Meeker Citizens of the World, Tyee Park Elementary, Tillicum Elementary, Mill Pond Elementary, Boze Elementary (50%), Mullenix Ridge Elementary, Kitsap Lake Elementary and Lister Elementary (50%). Tulalip funds were also used for transportation of students from Tyee Park Elementary and Tillicum Elementary. Some of their thank you notes are attached to this report.


Museum of Glass is very grateful for the ongoing partnership we have with Tulalip Tribes and we look forward to exploring new ways to make an even greater impact on our community together.
