Dear Marilyn and all our friends at Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund,

On behalf of the Board of Trustees and staff at Museum of Glass (MOG), thank you again for the grant of from Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund (**Q4 2021 14.2**) supporting two of our K-12 educational programs: **Creating Connections** and **Field Trip Fridays**. These programs have been vitally important as we re-engage youth and families post-pandemic.

Creating Connections is a popular program for children, attracting K-12 students from local public and private schools. Through the support of Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund, MOG assisted over 2000 K-12 students to make connections between our gallery exhibitions and the world in which they live. Students participated in docent-led conversations in the galleries, an art-making experience in our Education Studio and a visit to the Hot Shop to see glass artists at work.

Field Trip Fridays hold value for families, especially those who are homeschooled. Instead of traditional school tours, Field Trip Fridays is our way to reinforce student access and engagement with arts and culture in their community. Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund helped us provide 98 free admission tickets to small family groups and produce discussion guides to prompt questions and meaningful conversations around selected artworks.

I have attached some photographs and documents that demonstrate the impact of the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund's investment. There are photographs of students exploring the galleries, interacting with the emcee in the Hot Shop and participating in hands-on art making in our Education Studio. I've also included Field Trip Friday's curriculum for two exhibitions that we provided to families as well as results from surveys completed by Field Trip Friday participants.

Please extend our sincerest thanks to the Tulalip Tribe joining with MOG to inspire personal creativity of our youngest visitors. We believe these experiences lead to young people experiencing greater self-worth and ultimately to a sense of wellbeing.
