Thanks to the support of the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions, we have completed another successful season of Youth Leadership Adventures! We had 45 students participate in our program this summer, and nearly all of them were awarded a scholarship thanks to the generous support of donors like you.

Over the season, it was so inspiring to see the strong connections being formed between participants, the thoughtful discussions taking place about climate resiliency and the personal progress being made during their trips in the North Cascades. Here is an example of the meaningful impact the program had on these students:

Ashley was a junior at Burlington-Edison High School when she applied for Youth Leadership Adventures. Ashley shared how excited she was to meet new people and connect with nature. At the end of the trip, Ashley shared how the experience helped her gain more confidence and resilience. She also expressed gratitude for the new knowledge and friends she gained. Now that her trip has ended, Ashley is back home focusing on her senior year of high school.

Ector was a sophomore at Burlington-Edison High School when he applied for Youth Leadership Adventures. Ector shared that he was excited to try new things and experience both backpacking and canoeing for the first time. After his trip, Ector reflected on the strong bonds that were made with the other students and he also expressed appreciation for the support of his instructors. Now that his trip has ended, Ector is back home focusing on his junior year of high school.

Kim was a junior at Burlington-Edison High School when she applied for Youth Leadership Adventures. This was Kim's second trip with YLA, having done her first trip last summer. Kim shared that she was excited to return to the North Cascades this year to meet new people and try canoe-camping for the first time. After her trip, Kim shared that this was the best experience she had ever had. She stated how grateful she was for the things she learned and
