Dear Ms. Sheldon and Tribal Members:

PEI is grateful to have received funding from the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund for 2018. We have been working hard to meet growing demand, build community bridges, and deepen student learning throughout Washington State using our FieldSTEM Model, which provides a framework for relevant, equitable and outdoor-based STEM education for students K-12.

We have continued to advance the state of STEM education statewide in several key ways: increasing our number of 'partner' districts implementing FieldSTEM statewide; helping districts tailor a system of real-world, locally relevant outdoor-based STEM curriculum that encompasses multiple grade levels and is integrated across subject areas; and strengthening our connections with non-profit organizations, tribes, and field-based businesses in the regions we serve

while bringing them together with local schools. Here are some of the

highlights of our work thus far this year:



Two teachers at the West and South Sound Teacher Leader Institute conduct a field investigation regarding temperature.

- In March 2018, more than 40 school and district administrators from 17 districts attended our Statewide Leadership Institute, including three from the coastal region and nine from the Puget Sound region. District leaders developed action plans to deepen implementation of FieldSTEM in their districts by creating interdisciplinary lessons and aligning curriculum across grade levels. Those efforts were further strengthened by the 117 teachers from 29 districts who attended our four FieldSTEM Teacher Leader Institutes in June.
- Since the beginning of the year, **PEI has offered more than a dozen workshops for educators around the state,** providing training in topics like creating High Impact Field Experiences for students, Designing Performance Tasks, GIS in the Classroom, Field Observations and Outdoor Science through Notebooking, Ocean Science, Conducting Winter Field Investigations, and more. Two of our workshops were designed specifically for teachers from Educational Service Districts (ESDs) who want to integrate FieldSTEM across grade levels and subject matter: ESD 112 and ESD 113.
- We are continuing to develop a 'blended-learning' FieldSTEM model, so that even the most rural and remote
 district and school leaders know that we have the platform for our coordinators to provide ongoing support to
 their teacher teams. The model will provide the benefits of in-person learning as well as the accessibility of online
