We would like to take this opportunity to thank the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund for the support of the project "Roots to Wings Mentoring Program (RTW)", undertaken here at Pacific Northwest University of Health Sciences (PNWU).

For the 2016-2017 school year, RTW convened seven times from September to April and served 115 students. The curriculum included activities to increase the awareness of each other's cultures, challenges, individual aspirations and opened doors for the students to see what no book in the classroom could show them. Each of the RTW sessions lasted approximately 90-minutes to allow participants to engage and participate in a variety of learning activities, including lectures, small group discussions, basic Life Support Lab, the Human Anatomy Lab, ongoing cultural discussions and demonstrations, practice sessions in our Simulation Lab, and building a co-mentoring relationship with their mentors. In addition, 10 students from RTW are attending the National Institute of Neurological Disorders and Stroke (NINDS) Summer Internship Program (SIP) and four PWNU Scholars are participating in translational research at the NINDS SIP.

The generosity of the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund made this advancement in education and the continuation of Roots to Wings possible.


