

# fund expenditures

Funding from Tulalip Tribe provided 1000 new books for children in need in Snohomish County.

## objectives accomplished

2013 marked the second year of Page Ahead's Book Up Summer! pilot program. Partnering with 9 elementary schools in the Seattle and Highline school districts, Book Up Summer gave 33,516 new books to 2,793 students to read during their summer vacations. By maintaining their reading skills during the summer, these students will return to school in the fall ready to learn.

In addition to Book Up Summer, Page Ahead's Books for Kids program reached 29,691 children in 22 counties across Washington State with 82,793 new books.

During the 2012-2013 program year, Page Ahead:

- Provided 32,118 children birth to age twelve with 116,705 new books.
- Delivered services through 133 partner sites.
- · Presented 36 Families Read workshops in both English and Spanish, in King, Snohomish, Pierce, Skagit, Thurston, Walla Walla, Stevens and Spokane counties.
- Provided 374 Story Times to 1,318 children in 52 classrooms.

### evaluation

- 96% of responding partner sites rated Page Ahead programs as "Extremely Valuable" or "Very Valuable" in improving children's reading skill
- 99% rated us "Extremely Valuable" or "Very Valuable" in increasing children's reading time
- 94% rated us "Extremely Valuable" or "Very Valuable" in involving parents
- 98% rated us "Extremely Valuable" or "Very Valuable" in increasing children's interest in reading
