# Project Descriptions

## 2019-2020

### **“Hanging with Calder” Sept 2019 – Nov 2019**

**Guest Artist: Kit Kuhn**

Students will design and create copper wire pendants based on the inspirational work of historical artist Alexander Calder. Students will learn simple metal-working techniques and get a chance to use the tools professional jewelers use. Project developed by local jeweler Kit Kuhn.

- Properties of metal as an art medium
- Use and techniques of metal working tools

### **“The Magic of Molas” Nov 2019 – Feb 2020**

**Guest Artist: Hannah Jay**

Travel with Peninsula *Hands On Art* to the San Blas Islands near the Panama Canal where Kuna people make and wear the most colorful MOLAS (decorated clothing) out of embroidery and fabric. Explore animal designs of the jungle and create MOLA-STYLE masterpieces of both organic and geometric shapes, patterns and lines.

- History and geographical inspiration of Guna people and the San Blas Islands, Panama
- Recognize organic and geometric shapes in art
- Create a layered design and use bright colors to draw & collage a cut paper design
- Local artist profile- Hannah Jay

### **“Waste Notes” Feb 2020 – April 2020**

**Guest Artist: Mandi Thorne**

One man’s trash is another man’s treasure! Inspired by the work of Pacific NW artist Marita Dingus students will make personal whimsical sculptures with wire and cloth and then decorate them with recycled and found objects. Old CD’s, ribbon, shells... time to clean out the junk drawer!

*The 2019-2020 school year brought amazing opportunities and unforeseen challenges to Peninsula Hands On Art. Here are some fun facts about bringing exceptional art education to over 4,000 students!*

- **450+ Parent and community volunteers and organizations donated love, time, and funding to make PHOA a success.**
- **3,350 feet of copper wire was cut into 6” pieces to create Alexander Calder inspired copper pendants.**
- **Students took a visual journey to the San Blas Islands of Panama to create paper “Molas” influenced by the work of Henri Matisse.**
- **800 yards of fabric was purchased and cut into 18,000+ strips to produce our “Waste Nots” project.**
- **When schools abruptly shut down in March due to COVID 19 PHOA met the challenge by making 2,000 “go home” kits for students who had not completed the “Waste Not” project in class.**
