Here at Pickford Film Center we are grateful for support from Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund, that helped us to once again present a quality cultural program to thousands of local students from public and tribal middle schools in Whatcom County. A total of 3,834 middle school students attended film screenings at our theater, 375 of which were able to join us because of the generous grant PFC received from Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund.

By expanding Doc-ED outside the city of Bellingham, we continue to reach far greater numbers of minority students who attend County schools, specifically Native American students (85% live in the County), Pacific Islander students (70% live in the County), and Hispanic students (61% live in the County). We also served our first school from Skagit County, and thanks to support from our community we were able to pay for their transportation to Bellingham, and access to a curriculum not available in Skagit County.

Students had the opportunity to see one of two films:

Inventing Tomorrow

Passionate teenage innovators from around the globe are creating cutting-edge solutions to confront the world's environmental threats—found right in their own backyards—while navigating the doubts and insecurities that mark adolescence. Take a journey with these inspiring teens as they prepare their projects for the largest convening of high school scientists in the world, the Intel International Science and Engineering Fair (ISEF).

Youth Unstoppable

Youth Unstoppable is a documentary that gives a voice to kids on the front lines of climate change. Set against stunning visuals of a planet in crisis, the film tells the untold stories of youth around the world standing up for a green, sustainable future they refuse to let slip away. They are too young to vote but will be the ones living in the world shaped by decisions made today.

We are grateful for the continuing support from Tulalip, and look forward to another year of important Doc-ED programming.
