PROJECT GOALS SUMMARY

Pratt's Teen Program is designed to help students experience the joy of creativity while developing essential life skills, including problem-solving and risk-taking skills, understanding complex concepts, and discovering healthy ways to articulate the way they think and feel.

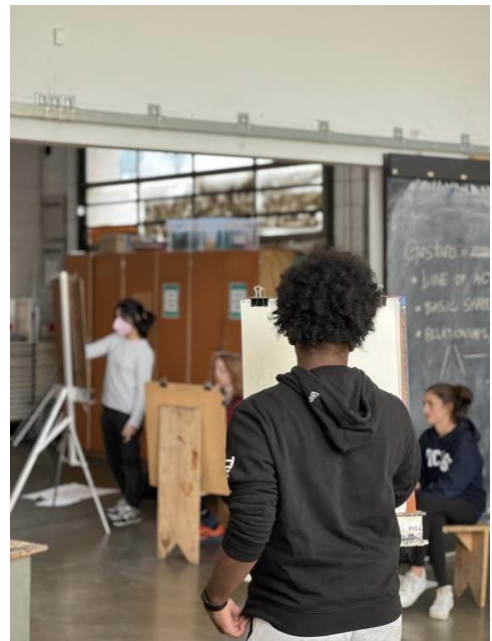
KEY ACTIVITIES

Through active, inquiry-guided learning and cooperative engagement, Pratt teaching artists provided hands-on visual arts instruction in a safe and supportive learning environment.

Teen students explored classes including Welding & Blacksmithing (beginning, intermediate, and advanced options); Lost Wax Casting; Figure Drawing; Still-Life Drawing; Screenprinting; Glassblowing; Glass Fusing; Jewelry; and Woodworking. Middle school youth (ages 11-13) discovered the fundamentals of art, including drawing, painting, printmaking, collage, clay, and mixed media.

PROJECT IMPACT

Pratt offered 25 after school and weekend classes for middle and high school youth and teens (134 total sessions), including 6 weekend pay-what-you-can classes for ages 11-13 (28 sessions; 56 hours). Twelve teaching artists provided 364 hours of hands-on instruction to 150 students.
