We are so grateful for the grant we received from Tulalip Cares and want to share a bit about Camp Prov, one of the many ways the money we raise benefits the healthcare needs of children in our community.

As the members of the Tulalip Tribes warmly welcomed the Canoe Journey paddlers and pullers to Tulalip Bay yesterday, children with a variety of special needs were gathered at Forest Park in Everett to enjoy a carefree day at camp beneath the same blue sky. Camp is held for five weeks in the summer with two sessions each day, serving over 300 kids.

Founded by Providence General Children's Association and Providence Children's Center in 1996, the camp pairs children with special healthcare needs such as autism, traumatic brain injury and sensory disorders with student volunteers for games, crafts, singing, nature walks and the wildly popular splash pad.

Along with supporting Camp Prov, PGCA volunteers also raise money to help babies born prematurely, children who have been abused and teens who are homeless. We support reading and clothing programs, offer scholarships and help feed kids who suffer from food insecurity.
