The Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions Fund has allowed for the expanded support for adults with intellectual disabilities to be served with a Guardianship Office.

Over the years, it has become evident that some people with intellectual disabilities have not been able to have a good quality of life that they should. This is due to the lack of a Guardian to advocate on their behalf. Entitlement services such as Social Security, housing, and medical are all areas in which having a Guardian is needed if the client is unable, or does not understand how to acquire services. Many people with intellectual disabilities cannot afford the financial process in obtaining a Guardian.

With the support of the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contribution Funds, we have been able to furnish an entire office with all of the necessary equipment and supplies to begin supporting up to forty (40) people with intellectual disabilities in need of guardianship. Quilceda Community Services continues to look for ways to expand and serve the special-needs population in North Snohomish County. Providing guardianship services is another way to help our most vulnerable population succeed in becoming a part of our healthy community.

Attached are pictures of the donated office space and the office equipment the Tulalip Tribes have provided. A computer, scanner/fax/printer are on order as well.
