Q1 2015 14.2 SCIDpda Final Report: Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund Grant Award

In 2015, The Seattle Chinatown International District Preservation and Development Authority (SCIDpda) applied for a grant award from the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund to support SCIDpda's annual signature fundraiser and 40th Anniversary Celebration, which serves as the organization's sole fundraising event. The fundraiser generates funds that directly support the organization's work in offering affordable housing and retail space, senior services, economic development, and community engagement.

The Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund generously granted SCIDpda an award of [REDACTED] to go toward sponsorship of our signature fundraiser. This sponsorship helped ensure that all proceeds went directly to the organization's community development work in the neighborhood.

We at SCIDpda were pleased with the results of the fundraising event. On October 16, 2015, we hosted 143 guests at the Wing Luke Museum of the Asian Pacific American Experience in the Seattle Chinatown International District. During our event, we had a live auction facilitated by auctioneer Laura Michalek; showed a video about SCIDpda that shares our organization's work with guests and also captures stories essential to the CID by local filmmakers Tay and Val; and offered Filipino food from local vendor Food & Sh*t. Thanks to the support of the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund, our event raised over \$97,000, allowing us to continue our work in the neighborhood, which impacts approximately 10,000 people who live and/or work in the District.

In 2016, we hope to plan a signature fundraiser that is as successful as the event in 2015 so that we may continue to support our work around strengthening the neighborhood. We also hope to continue working collaboratively with like-minded organizations such as the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund.
