Final Report for Prior Funding

The Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions allowed Safe Streets to support our students in various activities throughout the year. While recovery from the pandemic made it more challenging to serve the number of students we would have liked, we were able to partner with the Tacoma Schools and Franklin Pierce School District to serve as many students as we could.

Through the funding we were able to provide advocacy training and community service opportunities for the students to give back to their own communities. This involved taking multiple youth to a well-child health fair to complete Child ID's for any youth or vulnerable person and volunteer at a food bank called Eloise's Cooking Pot that serves vulnerable populations.

In total we worked with 5 middle schools students throughout the year and 15 high school students. Three high schools students came to our organization as Interns for the summer (June through August) and were engaged in planning and implementing events and activities they were passionate about. They learned about advocacy and using assess, plan, and improve cycle were encouraged to get involved in creating change within their own communities and work towards a project that will reflect that change. Your contribution to Safe Streets enabled us to continue to support these students in their efforts by supplying materials and snacks to complete their projects. The total recipients impacted by these efforts totaled over 500 community members.
