
Here are some key facts: 26 students from TAF Academy participated in the 3-day trip aboard Carlyn. Only 8 of the students identified as Caucasian, making for a diverse group of 9th and 10th graders. Salish Sea Expeditions' educators worked with the students for 4 hours in the classroom prior to the trip, covering topics such as scientific method, environment of the Puget Sound, and trip logistics. The students developed their research question, planned meals, and reviewed packing lists. Following the trip, the educators returned to the classroom for a 2-hour post-expedition wrap-up. The students had a phenomenal marine science and sailing adventure, setting them up for future STEM successes. Thank you!

I am delighted to let you know how the donation to Salish Sea Expeditions from the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Funds was put to good use.

Last fall, students from the TAF Academy in Federal Way participated in a 3-day trip aboard *S/V Carlyn*, the 61' research sailing vessel that Salish uses for its Sound program. I've included two great photos from that trip, and a link to the entire Flickr photo album is <u>here</u>.



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TAF Academy has a student population of which 52% qualify for free/reduced lunch subsidy. We provided \$6200 in scholarship support to facilitate the school's participation. That is almost 2/3 of the total program value (\$9400). The formation of the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund represents over half of our scholarship support. The kids had a great experience, made possible thanks to your generosity.

Marilyn, we raise our hands in gratitude and appreciation for your support of student-led marine science learning and empowerment through sailing on the waters of Salish Sea. Please extend our thanks to the Elders and other leaders of the Tulalip Tribe for their support of our greater Salish community.
