Dear Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund,

Your support of Scarlet Road impacted survivors of sex trafficking in Kitsap County.

During the past 12 months:

- 76 victims of sex trafficking or exploitation received trauma-informed support
- 596 youth participated in *Unbroken* training, and were equipped to recognize, avoid, and safely report sex trafficking or exploitation
- 31 victims of sex trafficking or exploitation participating in wraparound aftercare services, moving toward healing and independence

Total number of recipients impacted: 703

Scarlet Road continued offering crisis and wraparound services to victims throughout COVID-related shutdowns. Although the closure of schools and many other organizations raised enormous barriers reaching vulnerable youth and victims in crisis, we responded by equipping a new youth-designated advocate to connect with youth in teen centers, juvenile detention, and in the broader community.

Kalynn's Story:

When the pandemic hit, Kalynn's trafficker locked her in a house, cut off from anyone who could help. She finally managed to escape her abuser, only to find herself alone and homeless. A community service provider connected Kalynn to Scarlet Road in the midst of the COVID shut-down, needing medical and mental health services, housing, clothing, and food. Within days, the Scarlet Road team found temporary shelter housing for Kalynn and helped meet her needs for mental health services, clothing, and food.
