Dear Ms. Sheldon and Board Members:

The Tulalip Tribes Charitable Fund granted **in 2014** to purchase a second furnace for our state of the art hot shop and expand opportunities for professional artists, as well as training for students. *(I have included a photo sheet.)* 

We still need \$20,000 to purchase the furnace. However, those funds are held in reserve as we work to finish fundraising the full purchase price of \$40,000.

In 2014, more than 2,000 students, citizens and professional glassblowers benefited from use of the Schack Hot Shop. Some took classes to learn to blow glass. Others stepped into the shop to work with the glassblowers to create unique seasonal glass, i.e. glass sea floats. And, many professional glassblowers and their teams from throughout Snohomish County and beyond rented the hot shop to create works for private collections, galleries and museums.

One student wrote us: *Learning to blow glass has been a lifelong dream. Thank you for giving me the opportunity.* 

With the addition of the second furnace, we anticipate a 30% increase in the number of people impacted. We are thrilled by the potential to impact more community members of all ages with access to high quality art production equipment.
